**Academic Accommodations for Students Observing Fall Jewish Holidays**

The following major Jewish Holidays (holidays on which work is prohibited according to traditional Jewish law) occur during the fall semester (Holidays start at sundown of the evening prior to the full day.)

In 2017, the Jewish New Year begins on Wednesday evening, September 20. The holidays continue on for the whole month (almost).

**Classes and Exams subject to accommodation for the Jewish High Holidays**

Below are the dates when work is halachically prohibited (per Jewish law)  
Holidays start at sundown of the evening prior to the full day.

Rosh Hashanah (Jewish New Year): September 20 (evening) 21 and 22, 2017

Yom Kippur Eve: September 29 (Kol Nidre), 2017

Yom Kippur (Fast Day): September 30 2017

Sukkot (Festival of Booths): October 4 evening, 5-6th, 2017

Shemini Atzeret: October 11, 2017

Simchat Torah: October 12, 2017
